Types of Blood Release- Desperate, Urgent and Routine

In some situations, patients may require life-saving transfusion before the usual compatibility tests can be performed. The most frequently encountered clinical situations where emergency transfusion is required at Hospital are massive obstetric haemorrhage, paediatric trauma, neonatal exchange transfusion and massive gastro-intestinal bleeding.

There are different procedures adapted at blood centre for issuing blood to patients depending on the level of emergency.

Type of blood requests:

1. Desperate/Immediate:

- Under this situation; blood is issued immediately in 5-10 min of receipt of request from the doctor.
- Blood or blood components should be issued before completion of routine cross-matching tests in the case where delay in providing blood may jeopardize the patient's life, on receipt of a signed written request of the treating physician stating that the clinical condition of the patient is sufficiently urgent to require the release of blood before completing ABO and Rh(D) tests and compatibility testing.
- Under such circumstances, recipients whose ABO and Rh(D) type is not known should receive red cells of group O Rh(D)

negative if available, otherwise, O Rh(D) positive blood should be used (only if no history of transfusion with O positive Packed Red Cells).

- The donor tag or label on the blood container and the crossmatch report form should indicate that compatibility testing has not been completed at the time of issue. However, standard compatibility test should be completed promptly. If incompatibility is detected in further testing, the concerned clinician should be informed immediately to discontinue the transfusion.
- 2. Urgent:
- Under this situation; blood is issued immediately in 20-30 min of receipt of request from the doctor.
- Under these circumstances; the patient samples are received at the blood centre and subjected to ABO and Rh (D) typing and should receive ABO and Rh(D) specific blood group red cells before the tests for compatibility have been completed.
- Blood or blood components should be issued before completion of routine cross-matching tests in the case where delay in providing blood may jeopardize the patient's life, on receipt of a signed written request of the treating physician stating that the clinical condition of the patient is sufficiently urgent to require the release of blood before completing ABO and Rh(D) tests and compatibility testing.
- The donor tag or label on the blood container and the crossmatch report form should indicate that compatibility testing has not been completed at the time of issue. However,

standard compatibility test should be completed promptly. If incompatibility is detected in further testing, the concerned clinician should be informed immediately to discontinue the transfusion.

- 3. Routine:
- Most request received at the blood centre are routine type in which it takes 60-90 mins to Issue.
- The cross-match consists of detection of IgM and IgG type of antibodies in recipient serum against the antigens on donor red cells. It can be performed either by tube technique, column agglutination method or on solid phase.
- The blood is issued to the patient after completing the crossmatch.

Substance Abuse : Let's Fight with All our Might

Initiative by Ahmedabad medical association

Opiate and psychotropic drugs are valuable therapeutic tools when used as medically indicated for a variety of symptoms and conditions.

Unfortunately, non-clinical misuse of these addictive substances is an enormous problem worldwide.

Drug addiction is a complex social, economic and legal issue as well as a threat to public health and safety globally.

It affects people from all demographic and social groups and economic spheres. In addition to exposing themselves to the direct health risks related to the inappropriate use of these substances, persons addicted to drugs may engage in high risk behaviour, such as needle-sharing and unprotected sex, and many resort to criminal activity to finance their expensive addiction.

These factors increase transmission of viral infections, such as Hepatitis B and C and HIV/AIDS, among both users and non-users alike. Other results of addiction include failure to maintain employment or to function in social and family life.

We doctors are forefront in this fight against the substance abuse. Let us formulate this guidelines in our day to day practice.

1. Responsible prescribing practices

- Doctors should be aware of the addictive properties of certain psychotropic and opiate drugs.
- When such drugs are medically indicated, their use must be carefully monitored to ensure that the patient is following strict dosage instructions, timing and any other factors associated with the safe use of the particular drug.
- All appropriate measures must be taken to prevent the stockpiling, resale or other illicit usage of the drug.
- Doctors should be aware of non-medical factors that may predispose patients to addiction. These may include, among others, family history, past addiction, emotional trauma, depression or other mental health conditions and peer pressure, especially among young persons.
- Drug seekers often consult more than one physician in an effort to obtain multiple prescriptions. In extreme cases, drug seekers may harm themselves to create symptoms to obtain a prescription
- When prescribing any psychotropic or opiate substance to minors, doctors must ensure that the parents or guardians of

the patient are fully informed of the potential misuse of the drug and encouraged to monitor the child carefully to ensure adherence to the physician's instructions

2. Awareness raising and policy development

• Let us come together to promote appropriate drug prevention programming at all levels of the educational system.

Story of Tramadol

We all know this synthetic opiod has revolutionized the management of pain across all speciality. But as the class suggest long term missue of this medicine can lead to substance abuse. The reasons behind this are

- 1. Feel good chemical Dopamine which makes patient feel relaxed and calm.
- 2. Tolerance which leads to high dose giving effects
- 3. Withdrawal effect that leads to addiction to prevent the symptoms.

When this medicine are taken along with Alcohol, Other Painkillers, Sedatives, like Benzodiazepines and Sleeping Pills And Cold Medicine, the risk of developing an addiction is higher. Mixing these substances can lead to respiratory depression. It also increases the risk of seizure or overdose.

Recently we have seen a rise in abuse of alcohol, drugs and substance abuse. Ours is a young country and we need to protect the young from this abuse. They need the right information from the right people. And doctors are the best people to guide, prevent, treat and rehabilitate these young people.

Let's vow for Abuse free Youth.

Is there any role of PSA screening?

• Population based screening has no role in the present era, but opportunistic screening should be done. (when patient present with LUTS-lower urinary tract symptom)

What are LUTS (lower urinary tract symptoms)?

• Comprises STORAGE and VOIDING symptoms:

STORAGE Symptom include

- Frequency.
- Urgency.
- Nocturia.

VOIDING Symptom include

- Intermittency
- Poor Flow.
- Straining.
- Sense of incomplete evacuation.
- These are included in International Prostatic Symptom Score.

What is significance of DRE (digital rectal examination)?

• Sensitivity of DRE for detection of Ca. Prostate is low, but

palpable nodule is an indication of biopsy.

What basic urological investigations are needed when males> 50 years present with LUTS?

- Urine R/M, Urine C/S
- S.PSA

- USG KUB with Pre/PVR(pre and post void residue)
- Uroflowmetry

Why PRE/PVR needed with USG?

- Pre void volume gives idea of bladder capacity.
- Distended bladder gives an idea of bladder wall thickness and avoids missing intraluminal pathology.
- High PVR (post-void residue) could be a reason for recurrent UTI.

Is it possible when urine < R & M is negative and urine < c &s positive?

• Yes.

Why uroflowmetry needed?

• Gives pattern of individual flow and accordingly urologist can differentiate stricture / BPH/Functional disorder..

What to do for elevated S.PSA in Infection?

• In presence of active infection after adequate antibiotic course, PSA should be repeated at 6 weeks. If high, at that time then MRI prostate is required.

Couse of elevated PSA?

- UTI due to enlarged prostate.
- Acute urinary retention.
- Instrumentation.
- Catheterization.

What is the effect on S.PSA, when patient is on finasteride / dutasteride (5-alpha reductase inhibitor?)

• This drug reduces PSA by 50% if patient is on this medication for more than 6 months.

Can a patient have malignancy at PSA between 0-4 ng / dl?


- Yes, probability of having Ca Prostate around 20-25% when PSA is 2-4 & around 10% when PSA is below 2.
- There is actually no normal value.

What parameters are to be looked at for interpretation of significant PSA?

- Presence/absence of infection
- Size of prostate/volume of prostate
- Age of patient.
- Trauma / Catheterization/cystoscopy
- Alpha reductase inhibitor

Currently very limited role in presence of MRI.

Promoting Food Safety: Why Doctors Advocate Avoiding Adulterated Foods

Doctors should openly advise people to avoid food substances with a high chance of adulteration. Over the past year, numerous raids across India have uncovered adulterated foods, shedding light on the rise in inflammatory diseases, chronic illnesses, cancer, and allergies among the population. As healthcare professionals, we must be aware of common adulterants found in dairy products like cheese, butter, oil, ghee, and makhan.

- 1. Margarine: Margarine made from animal beef fat, also known as beef tallow margarine, can contain high levels of saturated fats, which may pose health risks when consumed excessively. Saturated fats have been linked to an increased risk of heart disease and other health issues. Additionally, margarine made from vegetable oils can be a significant source of omega-6 fatty acids. While omega-6 fatty acids are essential, an imbalance between omega-6 and omega-3 fatty acids, often due to overconsumption of omega-6s, can lead to inflammation and a higher risk of chronic diseases like heart disease, diabetes, and obesity.
- 2. Detergent in Milk: The use of detergent in milk is a serious adulteration practice aimed at artificially enhancing its whiteness and concealing dilution or contamination. This can lead to various health problems, including gastrointestinal issues such as nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea.
- **3. Annatto:** Annatto, derived from the seeds of the achiote tree, is a natural food additive commonly used as a coloring agent in food products. In India, it may be referred to as Ratanjot or Sindoori. Annatto can be found in various vegetarian food products, including cheeses, packaged snacks, butter,

margarine, processed foods, and baked goods. However, it's important to note that annatto has been statistically associated with allergic reactions and urticaria, particularly in children. Removing foods containing annatto from the diet has shown positive results in such patients.

Other common adulterants used are

- 1. Water: One of the most common forms of adulteration in milk is the addition of water to increase volume and dilute the milk's quality. This deceptive practice allows unscrupulous suppliers to sell more product while compromising its nutritional value.
- 2. Urea: Urea is another harmful adulterant that may be added to milk to increase its protein content artificially. However, ingesting urea-contaminated milk can have severe health consequences, including kidney damage and urinary tract infections.
- **3.** Formalin: Formalin, a chemical used to preserve dead bodies, is sometimes added to milk to prolong its shelf life and prevent spoilage. However, formalin is highly toxic and can cause serious health problems, including cancer and organ damage, when consumed.
- **4. Starch:** Starch is often added to milk to increase its thickness and viscosity, giving the impression of higher quality. However, starch adulteration reduces the nutritional value of milk and can lead to digestive issues in consumers.
- 5. Vegetable Oil: Unscrupulous suppliers may add vegetable oils to milk to increase its fat content artificially. While this may make the milk appear creamier, it can compromise its nutritional integrity and lead to adverse health effects, especially for individuals with dietary restrictions or allergies.
- **6. Artificial Sweeteners:** Some milk products, such as flavored milk or sweetened yogurt, may contain artificial sweeteners

like saccharin or aspartame to enhance their taste. While not inherently harmful, excessive consumption of artificial sweeteners can have adverse health effects, particularly for individuals with diabetes or metabolic disorders.

7. Synthetic Hormones and Antibiotics: In the dairy industry, synthetic hormones and antibiotics may be used to increase milk production and prevent infections in livestock. However, residues of these substances can find their way into milk and milk products, posing health risks to consumers, including antibiotic resistance and hormonal imbalances.

By being informed about these common adulterants and their potential health implications, doctors can play a vital role in promoting food safety and protecting the well-being of their patients.

They need to remove the cloud of secrecy and start teaching the clinicians about the technology. As of now clinicians are only used to fetch data from them.

We need to think about Professional liability and systemic bias also.

Barrier in AI :

- Trust: It can come only when technology is discussed and standardization protocols are established by the companies before gathering data's.
- 2. Clinical Utility: Predictive models are good for risk assessment. But therapeutic and diagnostic model need to pass the test of trust and liabilities. They appear lucrative but they need to improve outcome and actually save life
- **3. Practicality:** This models require high data input with accurate interpretation to make it more accurate. By feeding ECG strip with reporting done by existing ECG machines will make AI also faulty. Actual doctors need to feed data and interpretations. Predictability is good but whether actionable or not is also need of hour.

So there is urgent need of Committee who can decide all the factors right from standardization in data collection, inclusion and exclusion criteria, ethical issues and need of sharing across models to make this technology more robust.

A child if taught wrong from birth will never make right decisions.

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
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
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
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
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

Bowel Endometriosis management by colo-rectal resection: Laparoscopic surgical technique & outcome

Background and Objectives: Bowel Deep Infiltrating Endometriosis (DIE) management by colo-rectal resection is a complex procedure. The purpose of the present study is to delineate a meticulous approach to the assessment of the patient, step-wise surgical technique, pre, and post-operative care, and its short-term and long-term outcomes.

Methods: This is a single centre retrospective study done on patients of bowel DIE managed by colo-rectal resection between January 2019 to June 2021.

Results: There was a significant improvement in the symptomatology of patients post-surgery. Our surgical technique is feasible with acceptable short-term and long-term outcomes.

Conclusion: Bowel DIE management can be proficiently executed withproper diagnostic approach, appropriate surgical expertise with exhaustive pelvic anatomy knowledge especially concerning autonomic nerve plexus.

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
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CASE STUDY EXTRARENAL WILM'S TUMOUR

Vacancy for Histopathologist

- 7 year old male with complaints of abdominal pain
- No history of fever, nausea, vomiting, weight loss or haematuria.
- On CT scan, revealed a solid cystic retroperitoneal mass. Kidney and adrenals are normal
- Tumour markera ae normal (AFP, BHCG) with urinary VMA normal.
- Received specimen in multiple pieces, aggregating to 12 x 6.5 x 5 cm.



- Histopathology: trilineage nature of tumour cells consisting of blastemal, epithelial and mesenchymal elements
- · IHC
- Blastemal components are immunopositive for WTI, PAX 8 and Vimentin.
- Epithelial components are immunopositive for CK, PAX 8, WT 1 and BCL 2.
- Stromal component are immunopositive for Vimentin, CD 34 and CD 99.
- Desmin, Synaptophysin, S 100 and Chromogranin A are all negative.
- Extrarenal nephroblastoma is a rare entity, 0.5-1 %
- Differential diagnosis of a paediatric solid cystic retroperitoneal mass with normal kidneys include cystic extragonadal germ cell tumours, neurogenic tumours, with rare possibilities of myxoid liposarcoma
 - a second for all seconds


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A middle aged female was admitted with Systemic hypertension and severe back ache. On evaluation she was having accelerated high blood pressure and inequality of pulse. Normal ECG and normal LV function on Echo Doppler study. The CT Angio of aorta was showing a large dissecting aneurysm of thoracic aorta. She was stabilised with medicines.

Then she was planned for a hybrid intervention of thoracic aorta. This therapy is called TEVAR. It means thoracic endovascular aneurysm repair, in which patient's chest is not opened and from a small hole in the groin of patient through femoral artery the whole procedure is done.

Patient was shifted to Cath lab for the same.

A small incision - Arteriotomy - was given in the right groin by Vascular Surgeon and from right femoral artery a covered stent graft was advanced into the aorta in the true lumen. This was done under continuous fluoroscopic guidance in the digital Cardiac CathLab.


This is a rare disease and by timely diagnosis and intervention life of the patient could be saved.

The whole procedure was completed in thirty minutes. There was no blood product required for the procedure and also only local Anesthesia was given. The patient got discharged uneventfully and got her blood pressure under control.

Cardiology department of Jivraj Mehta and Krish Heart Care team's Dr.Jay Shah & Dr.Tarun Madan along with the help from Vascular Surgeons accomplished this case with meticulous planning and favourable outcome.



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
