'We are not Gods' to save docs from violence

Ahmedabad: An internal survey carried out by the Indian Medical Association (IMA) in 2017 revealed that one in three doctors under survey had reported facing some sort of violence in their career. "Nobody has authentic statistics as the definition of violence is also broad. But we are now pushing for the stringent norms to stop it," said Dr R V Asokan, secretary general of IMA.

Dr Asokan was one of the speakers at IIM Ahmedabad (IIM-A) on Saturday at an event to launch a short film 'We are not Gods,' The short film, made in association of acity-based hospital and IIM-A, is based on a true story and highlights issues inclu- for Management of Health Services at in the society.



The short film aims to create awareness about the violence faced by doctors

ding doctor-patient relationship, importance of right communication and expectations of the relatives.

IIM-A, said that the film is aimed at creating awareness about the violence faced by the doctors that not only affects morale of the professionals but also creates trust issues. "The film has been submitted to IMA and it would soon be made public," he said. When questioned whether IMA would

also pay heed to the genuine complaints in cases against the doctors, Dr Asokan said that all have duty to prevent unfortunate incidents and surely they would think about it. "We have already pushed the law to prevent violence with the central government and are hopeful of positive outcome," he said. BREAST CANCER-DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT

Breast cancer is the highest occurring cancer in women. The incidence of Breast cancer in India, Gujarat and Ahmedabad is increasing by leaps and bounds and the age of occurrence is decreasing. Younger women are diagnosed with cancer as early as in their 20s and 30s !

But the good thing is that Breast cancer is curable if detected at an early stage. So the key to cure is EARLY DETECTION !

Aetiology :

The exact cause of Breast cancer is not known but there are risk factors which are thought to increase the risk.

- 1. Early Menarche, Late menopause
- 2. Nulliparous women
- 3. Not breast fed the child
- 4. Family/Genetic history of Breast cancer
- 5. Taking hormones(Oestrogens)
- 6. History of Breast cancer in opposite breast

But probably in the Indian scenario some different factors play a role as most of the women do not have a family history or they have borne children and breast fed them. We do not know if the environmental factors, Diet or the stress of the modern day woman play a role in the increased incidence.

SYMPTOMS and SIGNS :

Usually there is a painless lump in the breast and/or axilla. Pain occurs in the benign cystic and inflammatory disease, rarely in cancer.

A bloody nipple discharge is usually from a papilloma but could be an early sign of carcinoma.Retraction of nipple, orange

peel like appearance of the skin, ulceration, redness are signs of advanced carcinoma.

DIAGNOSIS :

TRIPLE ASSESSMENT is done for diagnosis.

- 1. Clinical assessment by a Breast Surgeon
- 2. Radiology-Mammography &/Ultrasonography
- 3. Pathology Core biopsy of the lesion
 - Nipple discharge cytology

(FNAC is no longer used for establishing a diagnosis of Breast cancer)

* BREAST SELF EXAMINATION remains the main stay of early diagnosis and it begins as early as at the age of 20 years.

It should be done every month 3-4 days after completion of menstruation and any one day for the women who are menopausal or have undergone Hysterectomy.

TREATMENT

The treatment plan is decided as per the staging of the tumor.

In early and operable stages-usually Stage I,II and early III surgery is the first line of choice.

Surgery is usually of two types -

1. Breast Conservation Surgery (BCS)

Wide excision of the lump with clear margins

(margins can be confirmed with frozen section biopsy)

Axillary- sentinel lymph node biopsy in node negative disease on radiology or complete axillary clearance if the sentinel lymph node is positive.

Preserving the nodes reduces the cases of Lymphoedema, which is a common side effect of Axillary clearance.

2. **Modified Radical Mastectomy (MRM)** with or without reconstruction

Complete removal of the breast and axillary lymph nodes

In locally advanced disease, which means that the disease is only in the breast or axilla, but not metastasized to other distant areas, we can give **Chemotherapy** before surgery-Neoadjuvant Chemotherapy- to downstage the disease and make it operable.

In Stage IV disease we give palliative treatment.

The newer chemotherapeutic agents give very good results with fewer side effects.

Radiation is advised where we go for Breast Conservation Surgery or in cases of Mastectomy, where there is extensive axillary nodal disease or the size of the tumor is large.

PROTOCOL FOR SCREENING :

- Self Breast examination every month starting

from the age of 20 years(to know your normal)

-Clinical check up by a Breast Surgeon

Every year after 30-35 years

-Mammography and sonography

* Baseline- between 35-40

* Every 2 years- after 40 years

* Every year- after 50 years

These may be done at an earlier age if you have a positive family history of Breast Cancer or if you are BRCA positive(the gene responsible for heriditary breast cancer).

Understanding Corona Virus

We are not just fighting an epidemic; we are fighting an infodemic.

This is a time for facts, not for fear. This is a time for rationality, not for rumors. This is a time for solidarity, not for stigma.

Background :

An outbreak of pneumonia of unknown etiology in Wuhan City was initially reported to World Health Organisation (WHO) on December 31, 2019. A novel coronavirus was confirmed as the cause of the outbreak. Reportedly, most patients had epidemiological links to a large seafood and animal market which was closed on January 1, 2020. World health Organisation (WHO) declared a global health emergency over a new coronavirus that has killed at 1,700+ people following an outbreak in the central Chinese city of Wuhan. Nearly 68,500 cases of infection have been reported across China, most of them in Hubei province, of which Wuhan is the capital.

Virology :

Coronaviruses (CoV) are a large family of viruses that cause illness ranging from the common cold to more severe diseases such as Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS-CoV) and Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS-CoV).

The name coronavirus comes from the Latin word corona, meaning "crown or halo". Under an electron microscope, the image of the virus looks like a solar corona.

Coronaviruses are zoonotic, meaning they are transmitted between animals and people. Detailed investigations found that SARS-CoV was transmitted from civet cats to humans and MERS-CoV from dromedary camels to humans. Several known coronaviruses are circulating in animals that have not yet AHMEDABAD MEDICO NEWS 27-02-2020

infected humans.

A new virus called the 2019 novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV) has been identified as the cause of a disease outbreak that began in China. The Coronavirus Study Group of the International Committee on Taxonomy of Viruses has proposed that this virus be designated severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2). This is a new strain that had not been previously identified in humans. Little is known about it, although human-tohuman transmission has been confirmed. The disease is called COVID-19. (Figure 1 and 2)

There is not much known about this new virus yet. From past experiences with other corona viruses, it is presumed, but not proven that the virus will not survive the hot environment.

Who can catch infection?

People living or travelling in an area where the 2019-nCoV virus is circulating may be at risk of infection. At present, 2019nCoV is circulating in China where the vast majority of people infected have been reported. Those infected from other countries are among people who have recently traveled from China or who have been living or working closely with those travellers, such as family members, co-workers or medical professionals caring for a patient before they knew the patient was infected with 2019-

 $n\mbox{CoV.Health}$ workers caring for persons who are sick with 2019- $n\mbox{CoV}$ are at higher risk

People of all ages can be infected by the new coronavirus (2019-nCoV). Older people, and people with pre-existing medical conditions (such as asthma, diabetes, heart disease) appear to be more vulnerable to becoming severely ill with the virus.

Transmission:

Current estimates of the incubation period range from 1-12.5 days with median estimates of 5-6 days. These estimates will be refined as more data become available. Based on information from other coronavirus diseases, such as MERS and SARS, the incubation period of 2019-nCoV could be up to 14 days. WHO recommends that the follow-up of contacts of confirmed cases is 14 days.

The animal source of the 2019-nCoV has not yet been identified. It's likely that an animal source from a live animal market in China was responsible for some of the first reported human infections. The disease is not likely to transmit from pet animals.

The new coronavirus is a respiratory virus which spreads primarily through contact with an infected person through respiratory droplets generated when a person, for example, coughs or sneezes, or through droplets of saliva or discharge from the nose. The question of whether asymptomatic individuals with COVID-19 or individuals in the incubation period can transmit the virus to others remains controversial.

Clinical features :

As with other respiratory illnesses, infection with 2019-nCoV can cause mild symptoms including a runny nose, sore throat, cough, and fever. It can be more severe for some persons and can lead to pneumonia or breathing difficulties. More rarely, the disease can be fatal.

SARI : Severe acute respiratory infection with Corona Virus is defined as An ARI with history of fever or measured temperature ≥

38 C° and cough; onset within the last ~10 days; and requiring hospitalization. However, the absence of fever does NOT exclude viral infection.

WHO analysis of currently available data showed 82 percent of cases appear to be mild, about 15 percent progress to severe and 3 percent are critical.

In a study describing 138 patients with COVID-19 pneumonia in Wuhan, the median age was 56 years (interquartile range 42 to 68 years). Nearly all (99 percent) reported fever, 59 percent had a dry cough, and 35 percent had myalgias. Dyspnea developed in 31 percent after a median of five days of illness.

Mortality:

With more than 1,700 recorded deaths, the number of fatalities from this new coronavirus has surpassed the toll of the 2002-2003 SARS outbreak, which also originated in China.

SARS killed around 9 percent of those it infected - nearly 800 people worldwide and more than 300 in China alone. MERS, which did not spread as widely, was more deadly, killing one-third of those it infected.

While the new coronavirus is more widespread in China than SARS in terms of case numbers, the mortality rate remains considerably lower at **approximately 2 percent**, according to WHO.

Acute respiratory distress syndrome developed in 20 percent, and mechanical ventilation was implemented in 12.3 percent; 6 patients died; those who died had higher D-dimer levels and more severe lymphopenia than survivors. Similar clinical features have been described in other smaller cohorts of patients from Wuhan with confirmed COVID-19

<u>Diagnosis</u>:

Patients with fever and/or cough and with conspicuous ground grass opacity lesions in the peripheral and posterior lungs on CT images combined with normal or decreased white blood

cells and a history of epidemic exposure are highly suspected of 2019-nCoV pneumonia, of course those having a history of exposure.

Laboratory abnormalities include lymphopenia and elevated aminotransferase levels. On admission, most patients have had normal serum procalcitonin levels. Parenchymal lung abnormalities on computed tomography of the chest, including bilateral patchy shadows or ground-glass opacities are quite common.

The CDC clinical criteria for evaluation of a 2019-nCoV patient under investigation (PUI)

1) FeverAND symptoms of lower respiratory illness (e.g., cough, shortness of breath)

-and in the last 14 days before symptom onset,

- History of travel from Wuhan City, China -or- Close contact2 with a person who is under investigation for 2019-nCOV while that person was ill.
- 2) FeverOR symptoms of lower respiratory illness (e.g., cough, shortness of breath)

-and in the last 14 days before symptom onset,

• Close contact2 with an ill laboratory-confirmed 2019nCoV patient.

CDC has developed a new laboratory test kit for use in testing patient specimens for severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), the virus that causes COVID-19. The test kit is called the "Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) 2019-Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) Real-Time Reverse Transcriptase (RT)-PCR Diagnostic Panel."

Collection of specimens :

Collect specimens from BOTH the upper respiratory tract (URT; nasopharyngeal and oropharyngeal) AND lower respiratory tract (LRT; expectorated sputum, endotracheal aspirate, or AHMEDABAD MEDICO NEWS 27-02-2020

bronchoalveolar lavage) for 2019-nCoV testing by RT-PCR.

Clinicians may elect to collect only LRT samples when these are readily available (for example, in mechanically ventilated patients). Serology for diagnostic purposes is recommended only when RT-PCR is not available.

Collect blood cultures for bacteria that cause pneumonia and sepsis, ideally before antimicrobial therapy. DO NOT delay antimicrobial therapy to collect blood cultures.

Dual infections with other respiratory viral infections have been found in SARS and MERS cases. At this stage we need detailed microbiologic studies in all suspected cases. Both URT and LRT specimens can tested for other respiratory viruses, such as influenza A and B (including zoonotic influenza A), respiratory syncytial virus, parainfluenza viruses, rhinoviruses, adenoviruses, enteroviruses (e.g. EVD68), human metapneumovirus, and endemic human coronaviruses (i.e. HKU1, OC43, NL63, and 229E). LRT specimens can also be tested for bacterial pathogens, including Legionella pneumophila

In hospitalized patients with confirmed 2019-nCoV infection, repeat URT and LRT samples should be collected to demonstrate viral clearance. The frequency of specimen collection will depend on local circumstances but should be at least every 2 to 4 days until there are two consecutive negative results (both URT and LRT samples if both are collected) in a clinically recovered patient at least 24 hours apart. If local infection control practice requires two negative results before removal of droplet precautions, specimens may be collected as often as daily

Treatment :

Immediate isolation remains the first and foremost step in management.

${\tt Specific anti-Novel-CoV\, treatments\, and\, clinical\, research}$

Limited information is available to characterize the spectrum of clinical illness associated with 2019-nCoV. No vaccine or specific

treatment for 2019-nCoV infection is available; care is supportive. However, those infected with 2019-nCoV should receive appropriate care to relieve and treat symptoms, and those with severe illness should receive optimized supportive care. Some specific treatments are under investigation and will be tested through clinical trials. There is no current evidence from RCTs to recommend any specific anti-nCoV treatment for patients with suspected or confirmed 2019-nCoV infection.

Unlicensed treatments should be administered only in the context of ethically-approved clinical trials or the Monitored Emergency Use of Unregistered Interventions Framework (MEURI), with strict monitoring.

The WHO and CDC recommend **glucocorticoids not be used in patients with COVID-19 pneumonia** unless there are other indications (eg, exacerbation of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease). Glucocorticoids have been associated with an increased risk for mortality in patients with influenza and delayed viral clearance in patients with Middle East respiratory syndrome coronavirus (MERS-CoV) infection

Management of hypoxemic respiratory failure and ARDS in Hospitalised patients :

- Give supplemental oxygen therapy immediately to patients with SARI and respiratory distress, hypoxaemia, or shock.
- Use conservative fluid management in patients with SARI when there is no evidence of shock.
- Give empiric antimicrobials to treat all likely pathogens causing SARI. Give antimicrobials within one hour of initial patient assessment for patients with sepsis
- Do not routinely give systemic corticosteroids for treatment of viral pneumonia or ARDS outside of clinical trials unless they are indicated for another reason.
- Closely monitor patients with SARI for signs of clinical deterioration, such as rapidly progressive respiratory failure

and sepsis, and apply supportive care interventions immediately

- Understand the patient's co-morbid condition(s) to tailor the management of critical illness and appreciate the prognosis. Communicate early with patient and family
- High-flow nasal oxygen (HFNO) or non-invasive ventilation (NIV) should only be used in selected patients with hypoxemic respiratory failure. The risk of treatment failure is high in patients with MERS treated with NIV, and patients treated with either HFNO or NIV should be closely monitored for clinical deterioration
- Recent publications suggest that newer HFNO and NIV systems with good interface fitting do not create widespread dispersion of exhaled air and therefore should be associated with low risk of airborne transmission
- In patients with moderate or severe ARDS, higher PEEP instead of lower PEEP is suggested.

The following measures ARE NOT specifically recommended as 2019-nCoV remedies as they are not effective to protect yourself and can be even harmful:

Taking vitamin C	Smoking		
Drinking tradition herbal teas	wearing multiple masks

Taking self-medication such as antibiotics			
Seeking early medical care with presumptive flu symptoms			
seems to be the key to better results			

Infection prevention and control (IPC)

WHO and CDC recommend following the standard precautions for avoiding respiratory viruses :

Wash of hands often with soap and water, or use of an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

Covering mouth and nose with elbow or tissue when coughing or sneezing.

Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth if your hands aren't clean.

Avoid close contact with anyone who is sick.

Avoid sharing dishes, glasses, bedding and other household items if you're sick.

Clean and disinfect surfaces you often touch.

Stay home from work, school and public areas if you're sick.

Avoid eating raw or undercooked meat or animal organs.

Avoid contact with live animals and surfaces they may have touched if you're visiting live markets in areas that have recently had new coronavirus cases.

Maintain at least 1 metre (3 feet) distance between yourself and other people, particularly those who are coughing, sneezing and have a fever.

Wearing a medical mask can help limit the spread of some respiratory disease. However, using a mask alone is not guaranteed to stop infections and should be combined with other prevention measures WHO advises on rational use of medical masks thus avoiding unnecessary wastage of precious resources and potential misuse of masks. This means using masks only if you have respiratory symptoms (coughing or sneezing), have suspected 2019-nCoV infection with mild symptoms or are caring for someone with suspected 2019-nCoV infection. A suspected 2019nCoV infection is linked to travel in an area in China where 2019nCoV has been reported, or close contact with someone who has traveled from China and has respiratory symptoms.
